Preface

The Andaman and Nicobar group of Islands consist of nearly 572 islands, rocks and islets with a total geographical area of 8,249 sq.km with 38 inhabited islands. The total provisional population according to 2001 census is 3,56,265. The decadal growth of population between 1971-81 was 63.93% while between 1981-1991 it was 48.70% and declined to 26.94% between 1991-2001. Population density is 43 persons per sq km. The rise in population can mainly be attributed to in-migration. Within the total population, the tribal population is 26,770 as per the 1991 census.

Planned development in these islands commenced in 1956. The outlay in the 2nd, 3rd, & 4th Five Year Plan was very meager and negligible infrastructure facilities could only be created. The size of the 5th & 6th Plan were also modest. The process of infrastructure development started only from 6th Five Year Plan.

The spending capacity of the Administration became substantial only from the Seventh Plan onwards when the outlay was comparable. The achievement was Rs.233.24 crores as against an outlay of Rs.285 crores. During the Eight Plan as against an initially determined outlay for the five-year period of Rs.685 crores, the actual achievement was Rs. 892.09 crores.

The performance of plan expenditure from 2nd Five Year Plan to 8th Five year plan is self explanatory.

During the first plan year of the 10th 5 year plan the plan expenditure was 99.76%. This achievement of plan expenditure is the highest in the country.

The total allocation for the Tenth Five Year Plan (2002-2007) as approved by the Planning Commission is Rs.2483.00 crores. Sector/sub-sector allocation of Annual Plan 2003-2004 is Rs.410.00 crores. Sector-wise distribution of revised allocation of Rs.410.00 crores for the year 2003-04 is tentatively as follows:-
